## WORKSHOP OUTLINE

The project is divided into three parts, and each part is broken down into three or more steps. At the end of each of the first two parts, you are asked to upload your work so I can assess your progress before you continue on to the next part. (I'll let you know if I see any problems.) Finally, at the end of Part 3, you upload your final painting for a critique.

You work at your own pace according to your own timetable; some individuals may finish their painting in one or two days, a few may need a week, and others may prefer to schedule their painting time over the full two weeks.

## Part 1: Preparing for Painting

Step 1: Sketch the outlines of mountains and the different values of the sky on your canvas

- Step 2: Spray your sketch with fixative
- Step 3: Paint a thin layer of gesso on your canvas to lighten your sketch lines
- Step 4: Read the following tips for painting with a scriptliner brush
- Step 5: Thinning paint for using a scriptliner brush
- Step 6: Practice the art of painting with a scriptliner brush
- Step 7: Creating your artistic signature

Upload Steps 1, 6, and 7 so I can see how you are doing before your begin Part 2.

## Part 2: Painting with Four Values (Background)

Step 1: Trying out the scoop and spread technique by mixing one light value

- Step 2: Mixing three more light values
- Step 3: Painting the sky and two mountains

Upload your painting so I can assess your progress before your begin Part 3.

## Part 3: Painting Mountains (Middle Ground and Foreground)

- Step 1: Mixing three more values
- Step 2: Paint three more mountains
- Step 3: Experiment with painting the shapes of trees
- Step 4: Paint two more mountains with trees
- Step 5: Sign your name
- Upload your final painting for a critique.
