Diane lives in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, and Panicarola, Italy.


Artist

Art and Teaching Philosophy


My love of art begins with a desire to share the beauty of the world around us.


Classical drawing and painting techniques are for me the tools for achieving this goal.

Diane Cardaci is the author of three drawing instruction books, published by Walter Foster.


